## Where to plant:

- Sunny location, well-drained soil with few weeds

## Planting Directions:

- Prepare soil to a depth of several inches
- Remove weeds and ensure a clean seed bed
- One ounce of seed will cover 250 square feet
- To seed evenly, mix the wildflower seeds with sand - four parts sand to one part seed
- After seeding, lightly rake and water the seedbed with a fine spray

## Fall Treatment:

- After a freezing frost, using a lawnmower with no discharge and raised to its highest cutting height, cut the plants so that all seed is driven down into the mulch. This will ensure that the annuals will reseed themselves in the spring.
