## KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS (KBG)

### TIREM

---

Tirem has deep roots and exceptional performance in drought conditions, and it maintains its winter colour remarkably well. This variety also displays high tolerance to salt and heat pressure and good overall disease resistance, specifically to dollar spot, rust, summer patch and red thread.

- Can handle low mowing (up to ½ inch)
- Germinates and establishes rapidly
- Drought, heat and salt tolerant
- Good spring green-up
- Resistant to diseases such as dollar spot, rust, summer patch and red thread

## KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS (KBG)

### FULL MOON

A hybrid, Full Moon exhibits a rich, dark green colour, with a medium-fine leaf texture. The variety has excellent heat and drought tolerance, making it a good blending component with other bluegrasses and tall fescue.

- Good winter colour
- Excellent stem rust resistance
- Useful in blends with dark blue-coloured bluegrasses and perennial ryegrass
- Good summer performance and high seed yield potential

### BEDAZZLED

Bedazzled Kentucky Bluegrass has broad applications as a mono-stand and a blending variety. Bedazzled is classified as a “compact-America” type, which means it can be mowed as close as ½ inch and it has high disease resistance, including an R-rating for powdery mildew, brown patch and typhula blight. It also has slower growing habits for reduced mowing.

# PERENNIAL RYEGRASS (PRG)

# FESCUE

## HEATHLAND (CHEWINGS)

The latest generation of fine fescues, Heathland Chewings Fescue achieves new performance heights in its quality, its drought tolerance and its low maintenance requirements. Heathland has the characteristics of Chewings Fescue, with fine leaf texture, high shade tolerance and allelopathic qualities that resist weed overgrowth. It also requires less frequent mowing than ryegrass, tall fescue or Kentucky bluegrass, and it performs well in low-fertility areas.

- Excellent drought tolerance
- Performs very well in low-fertility areas
- Disease resistance and allelopathic qualities that reduce weed infestation

## SHADOW III (CHEWINGS)

As its name suggests, Shadow III Chewings Fescue grows well in shade, in addition to showing strong tolerance to drought conditions, fast recovery from summer stress, and the ability to withstand low mowing regimes. Shadow III has a bright, medium vibrant green colour with increased turf quality, disease resistance and high levels of endophyte. It’s an ideal choice as a standalone or in a blend with other cool-season grasses such as perennial ryegrass and Kentucky bluegrass, or with tall fescue.

- Shade and drought tolerance
- Rapid recovery from summer stress
- Low fertility and moisture requirements, germinates rapidly
- Dense, tight-knit turf with fine leaf texture
- Great in blends

# FESCUE

## CELESTIAL (CRF)

Celestial Strong Creeping Red Fescue represents an advanced generation of synthetic fine fescue cultivars that expand the applications for this species. At home in the sun or partial shade, Celestial represents the best in low-maintenance turfs. Because of its fine leaf texture and darkest of green colours, it is highly recommended that Celestial be included in mixtures with perennial ryegrass and Kentucky bluegrass at a concentration of up to 40%.

- Performs very well in low fertility
- Low maintenance and low input requirements
- Summer and winter colour
- Resistant to many turf diseases, including leaf spot and red thread

## SALTILLO (TALL)

Saltillo tall fescue is a dark green cultivar with excellent summer turf performance. With high heat, salt and drought tolerance, Saltillo also resists diseases such as brown patch, gray leaf spot, net blotch, stem rust and crown rust. Saltillo is adapted for lawns, golf course roughs, cemeteries, parks, sod production, sports fields, roadsides – and even slope stabilization.

- Very salt and drought tolerant (great summer turf performance)
- Disease resistant
- Performs well in sun or shade (great for low maintenance applications)

# FESCUE

## BIG HORN GT (HARD)

Big Horn GT is an American sheeps fescue with high turf performance, disease resistance, natural glyphosate resistance and increased seed yield. Big Horn GT displays a pleasing blue-green colour combined with good turf density and fine texture. These traits also contribute to an excellent range of mowing heights, from closely-mowed grass to natural areas. Big Horn GT can hold up as a mono-stand or perform well in blends and mixtures with other cool season grasses, especiallyvother fine fescues. It can be used in lawn mixtures with perennial ryegrass and Kentucky bluegrass for improved shade performance.

- Vertical growth, good turf density and fine texture
- Glyphosate-, cold- and shade-tolerant
- Great for weed-free, unmowed areas
- Increased seed yield
- Excellent contrast with darker green turf species

## NANOOK (HARD)

Nanook Hard Fescue is an extremely hardy turfgrass, exhibiting greater shade tolerance and disease resistance than other species of fescue. It is one of only five cultivars of hard fescues that are TWCA-qualified. It requires little maintenance on the mowing and fertilization front, making it ideal for situations – and growing environments – where upkeep is at a minimum.

- Hardy turfgrass
- Shade- and disease-resistant
